Special prizes will be forwarded, but if not received by 31 October, please notify the treasurer.

Trophies won on show day to be returned to the trophies administrator for inscription.

Challenge cups will be won outright if won three years in succession or five years in all, except those marked perpetual in the catalogue.

## Dalmally Agricultural Society Rules

1. The Society shall be known as the Dalmally Agricultural Society.
2. Membership is open to all. Subscriptions will be as decided by the Committee from time to time. The 2025 rate for full membership will be £6.00 payable to the Treasurer or Entry Secretary by closing date for entries. Members are admitted to the Show free of charge on production of their membership tickets, otherwise the full entry fee is applicable.
3. Any number of stock entries may be made. Fees will be decided by the Committee from time to time. Current 2025 fees (per entry) are as follows: Cattle and Sheep (all classes) £2.00; Dogs (paid on field) £2.00; Poultry £1.00; Children's classes (paid on field) £0.50; All other classes £0.50.
4. Competitors will lodge their entries in writing with the Entry Secretary by the 15<sup>th</sup> of August. Late entries will be accepted but will incur a £5 per exhibitor late entry fee.
5. All animals competing in the Show must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor for at least 3 months prior to the Show.
  - a. To enter the confined Cattle & Blackface sections, animals must also be in the possession of, on farm, for at least 3 months prior to the Show.
6. Show areas for 2025 shall be as follows:
  - a. Cattle – Confined – to the parishes of Glenorchy and Innishail, Kilchrenan, Dalavich, village of Lochawe, Inveraray, part of the parish of Kilmorich, to north of the river Kinglas and part of the parish of Ardchattan, east of the river Etive to its junction with Allt Fhaolain and thence along the parish boundary to its junction with the parish of Glenorchy.
  - b. Cattle – Open
  - c. Sheep – Confined – as (a) above (Blackface only)
  - d. Sheep – Open
  - e. Crooks & Sticks – Confined to North and South Lorn and the parish of Inveraray
  - f. Crooks & Sticks - Open
  - g. All other sections – Open
7. Shared ownership must be declared on the entry form. Shared animals will not be eligible for confined classes unless all owners live within the confined area.
8. 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> prize winners in the confined cattle and sheep classes will automatically be eligible to enter the corresponding classes in the open sections.
9. All exhibits must be placed in the show yard by **9.30am**, except dog show entries which are entered on the day before **1pm**. The committee will be in attendance from 8.30am to receive and place exhibits. **EXHIBITS MUST NOT BE REMOVED BEFORE 4pm** unless special permission has been obtained

from the relevant steward. All non-livestock exhibits must be removed by 5pm.

10. 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and HC prizes will be awarded in the cattle and sheep classes. The points in the cattle and sheep classes shall be 7, 5, 3 and 1 – in the event of a tie, the number of 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> prizes will be taken into account with the highest-ranking awards having the greatest weighting. In all other classes 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and HC will be awarded. The points shall be 5, 3 and 1 – in the event of a tie, the number of HC awards will be taken into account.
11. No animal can be exhibited for a special prize which has not been shown in its class.
12. All bulls and pedigree cattle are to be led.
13. Only one person will be allowed in the judging ring with cattle.
14. Riggs and chasers are not eligible.
15. All animals shown in a group must belong wholly, or in part, to a single exhibitor.
16. Only amateurs will be allowed to compete in all sections other than the livestock sections.
17. All vegetables must have been grown by the exhibitor, all baking, knitting, produce, jams, sticks etc. must be the work of the exhibitor and not exhibited previously at Dalmally Show.
18. Any exhibitor, or their representative, refusing to accept the judge's placing in any class will be disqualified. All disputes will be settled by the President, Secretary and the relevant Steward: all objections must be lodged by 6pm on the day following the Show and a £10.00 deposit made. The deposit will be forfeited if the objection is not sustained.
19. The Society will not be liable in any claim for loss or damage arising from accidents or otherwise, at or in connection with the Show.
20. All trophies held to be returned to the Trophy Secretary one month prior to the date of the Show.

**Any person entering stock at Dalmally Show is accepted with the understanding that they are agreeing to abide by the society rules as outlines about in addition to the conditions detailed below.**

1. All exhibitors must ensure that all the following details are given to the entry secretary on entering livestock: Name of owner, full address and telephone number, CPH number and flock/herd number and details of any stock handlers. Any changes to details provided must be given to the secretary before Show Day.
2. Cattle within animal health schemes must be reported to the Entry Secretary and a copy of the relevant certificate sent/emailed to the entry secretary no later than 2 weeks before the show to ensure IBR rules are applied on Show Day.

3. Exhibitors must adhere to the Transportation of Animals (cleansing and disinfection) (Scotland) Regulations 2005.
4. Separate movement documentation must be completed in full to move sheep to the Show and home and sent to SAMU.
5. All livestock must be tagged according to current regulations.
6. Cattle passports must accompany all cattle to the Show and be presented to the cattle steward before judging, no animal without a passport can be unloaded and penned.
7. All exhibitors must be aware of their responsibility in maintaining the safety of the public when moving animals.

**All Exhibitors must comply with any additional regulations as set down by the Scottish government which are in force on Show Day.**

### **Poultry regulations**

Exhibitors of Poultry must comply with regulations as set out by the State Veterinary Division in accordance with The Avian Influenza (Preventive Measures) (Scotland) Amendment Order 2024.

1. All exhibitors must cleanse and disinfect cages/crates/baskets used to transport birds to the Show ground. At the Show all litter and manure within cages or baskets must be contained until disposal, any spillages outside the cage must be cleansed and disinfected immediately. Litter and manure must be disposed of in a manner which does not present a risk of spread of diseases i.e. in a sealed bag for normal refuse collection so that other birds do not have direct access to it.
2. The exhibitor must ensure that they provide the entry secretary with their home and business address (if different), and any details of additional addresses bird exhibits have been kept in the 28 days prior to the Show. Any birds sold on Show Day must be reported to the secretary with details of new owner (name and address).

## PECAN PIE RECIPE



**Ingredients:** Shortcrust Pastry-17g plain flour, 15g icing sugar, 75g butter, 1 large egg yolk, approx. 1 tbsp cold water. Filling-25g softened butter, 175g light muscovado sugar, 3 large eggs, 200ml maple syrup, 1 tsp vanilla extract, 150g pecan halves.

**Method:** **1.** Pastry-add flour and icing sugar to a large bowl, rub in the butter until mixture resembles breadcrumbs. **2.** Add egg yolk and water, mix until you achieve a firm dough. Wrap in cling film and rest in fridge for 30 mins. Preheat oven to 200 °C/Fan 180 °C/Gas 6. **3.** Roll out dough onto floured surface, add to 23cm fluted flan tin. Prick pastry, line with baking parchment or foil and fill with baking beans. Bake for approx. 15 min. Remove beans and lining, return to oven for a further 5 min or until pale golden and dry. Reduce oven temperature to 180 °C/Fan 160 °C/Gas 4. **4.** Filling-beat butter and sugar, add eggs, syrup and vanilla extract, beat well. **5.** Arrange pecan halves flat side down on pastry, pour over filling. Bake for 30-35min until set. Filling will rise in the over but fall back on cooling. Leave to cool.

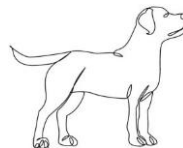
